Brief description of the event

The webinar brings together government, international organisations, trade unions, private sector and civil society in a conversation on gender equality in economic governance and rights, with a focus on the labour market, against the backdrop of pandemic recovery.

Covid-19 has increased gender inequalities and impacted women's socio-economic situation, with an increase in unpaid care and domestic work as well as gender-based violence.

Addressing unequal power structures both at home and in the workplace, along with access to social security systems is imperative for women's economic empowerment rights, and for improved resilience and recovery at societal level.
